As stated by Maria Montessori "the child learns unconsciously by taking in everything around him and actually constructs himself," much like an "absorbent sponge" and together with his "sensitive periods", otherwise referred to as "windows of opportunity" (which are those special times in his life when he easily incorporates a particular ability into his schema through repetition), he engages in this process.
