Editorial

The proceeds have been earmarked for the orphans and the people who lost their means of livelihood as a result of this tragedy. Add your CoB to this alphabet soup of organisations and you have the beginnings of a formidable force in our region. There are now suggestions to build and formalize this structure on a more permanent basis so that we can react to events of this nature more readily and swiftly, while also establishing the infrastructure needed to support local families in our own midst who might also be in need of financial and social help. We would expect more organisations and groups to affiliate with this combined group in the near future as has your Crescents of Brisbane which has also thrown its weight behind these projects. All funds raised from Crescents Kids4Kids will be channelled towards this joint initiative, *inshaAllah*.

sang the praises of those involved in the establishment of the new institution. Both pledged council and government support for the ongoing running and maintenance of the school. The Minister of Education called on students of the school to become ambassadors to our neighbouring Islamic countries and help build the bridges between our nations

Parents of prospective students and well-wishers were allowed to tour the facilities and to speak to teachers. Everyone was treated to a traditional Aussie-style barbie afterwards.

When the proposed final structures come into fruition there will be a modern, state-of-the-art campus in Brisbane that will not only cater to

the needs of the local community but to international students as well.

Solly Solwa was a fanatical and boisterous squash player and a man who literally could not sit for more than five minutes at any one time. One day, while tending his supermarket in Durban, a gunman fired off a shot during an armed robbery that went through his abdomen and lodged itself in his spine.

As a result of this Solly ended up confined to a wheelchair, the bottom half of his body paralysed from the waist down. A lesser man would have resigned himself to his fate and succumbed to despair and despondency, but not Solly. Intensive daily physiotherapy, hydrotherapy, biokinetics and acupuncture and the dedication of his wife, **Sara** and son, **Aboobaker**, saw him make a remarkable improvement, to the extent that he was now able to drive himself around in a modified vehicle, return to a full day at the supermarket and work out daily at the local gym.

That was 34 months ago. Today, Solly has already been for Umrah, travelled to Melbourne and Sydney and is now visiting family and friends in Brisbane. A remarkable achievement for a man who spent a whole year in bed unable to move a muscle.

Our *Man-on-the-Mussallah* played squash (and mostly lost) against him in the rebel non-racial Durban and Districts Squash League in the days when sport used to be divided on racial grounds. Still, our *Man-on-the-Mussallah* does not rate his chances highly even if they were to meet in the court today.
