Shane Johnson – Cooperation AFP/Customs/Aviation (AFP also)

When there are concerns around a person's travel through airports. Customs and AFP aviation Police will sometimes seek advice around whether or not there are notable concerns enough to arrest on suspicion of committing an offence. One such recent incident highlights some positive initiatives being undertaken between the agencies acknowledging a need for community involvement and guidance on some aspects of this issue when appropriate. The family of a particular youth had concerns about his travels and reported this to the police. Understanding the value of community assistance, the AFP investigators called AFP [Shane] seeking his input. Shane contacted a few community representatives who were extremely appreciative of being advised and consulted. Together they attended the AFP office at the airport, spoke with the young male and were able to mutually agree that there was no cause to make further enquiries regarding his intended travels. The community members assisted the youth with accommodation and transport due to him missing his flight (which was changed at no additional cost). The family were advised of the positive outcome and the youth later made contact with investigators to make known his travels.

Sultan Deen – Asked whether the checks were random or specific intelligence was available.

Shane Johnson - Responses at airports can relate to intelligence, observations, through dialogue and

via random means. People in airports can be stopped and spoken to for a multitude of reasons relating to a multitude of concerns/offences including drugs, people smuggling, counter-terrorism, sex trade, visa violations and organised crime.

Ali Kadri – AFP are flexible working with the community however Customs are not. Mr Kadri

also asked for greater cooperation especially during the Holy month of Ramadhan

and that Hajj (Pilgrimage) is not far away

Sultan Deen – Asked if there was a need for a police clearance beforehand

Shane Johnson - Clearance prior to travelling

There are no requirements for anybody to receive 'clearances' prior to travelling however a number of people have in the past have let him know of their pending travel plans due to perceptions in the community around travel warnings. If people wish to do this that is fine however it's not a requirement.

Yasmin Khan – Enquired if the AFP surveillance on women is as stringent as on men

Shane Johnson - Confirmed that to be the case

AFP surveillance

People working within airports are required to maintain an awareness across many issues as identified previously and should observe odd or suspicious behaviour that may raise suspicion about their activities. If this occurs than that person may be stopped and spoken to. This is not restricted to any one person, gender, ethnicity, religion or sulfural background.
