



QUEENSLAND STATE ELECTION

31 October 2020

The following has been created as a guide for the upcoming Queensland State Election. It is designed to provide handy info as well as identify the candidates from the three major political parties in Australia in selected electorates.

Before being able to vote, it is important to review your electoral enrollment and ensure all your details are up to date. If you have recently moved, ensure to update your details as it may change the electorate you vote in.

Not all electorates are listed. Electorates listed have taken in to account CCN readership and the predominantly Muslim populated suburbs in the Brisbane and Gold Coast region. If you live outside of these regions, please be sure to verify your candidates and details via the QEC website. Some electorates have suburbs divided between them (e.g. Mount Gravatt). Other Info

Information during election can be a lot to take in. Try to read the policies of your candidates and learn about the interests of political parties, their past, and rhetoric.

We must be careful where we obtain our information. Courier Mail, The Australian, Herald Sun, Daily Telegraph, and news.com.au are right wing and often biased in their reporting. Try to obtain information from reliable and unbiased sources. Guardian Australia is an excellent source of information, as too the ABC and The Conversation.

Candidates

In Australia, there are 3 major Political parties. The Australian Labor Party (ALP), The Liberal National Party (LNP), and The Greens. These parties make up the majority of political positions and often influence political decision and the political landscape. Some electorates may have candidates outside of these parties, or independent candidates. It is important to ensure you review all candidates in your electorate. Below you will find a list of the candidates from the 3 major political parties. It will list each candidate for the electorates selected as well as the party leader or candidate for premier.

The current electer MP for the electorate is also listed.

N.B. If your electorate does not have a candidate listed for your preferred political party, keep an eye on their website as some candidates may be nominated at a later stage. This is also a handy reminder to be aware of all candidates in your electorate in case your preferred party does not nominate a candidate. List is updated as of 20/09/2020

HOW TO VOTE

Early Voting:

Casting your ballot before election day is called early voting. This will open on 19 October. Everyone is welcome to vote early. Early voting locations will be listed at: <https://www.ecq.qld.gov.au/how-to-vote/how-to-cast-your-vote> once the election has officially been declared.

Election Day:

You may vote at one of the designated voting booths in your electorate on Election Day, 31 October 2020. Please be mindful of social distancing rules and regulations if choosing to do so.

Postal Voting:

Postal Voting is open and you can apply to vote by post at: <https://results.elections.qld.gov.au/Events/ElectorSearch?EventID=597&EventType=1> If planning to vote by post, please apply early to allow yourself enough time to receive your ballot paper and have your vote counted.

Ballot Paper:

In a state election, Queensland uses the Full Preferential Voting (FPV) system. This means you are required to place a number in each box next to the name of a candidate.

The ballot paper will look as below. Place your numbers in the box with 1 being your first preference, and the final number (depending on the number of candidates in your electorate) being your last choice. It is important therefore to know what other candidates and parties offer if they are not your preference so you can number correctly. In Queensland we vote for electorates and do not vote for the Premier directly. The Premier is determined by which part wins the majority of seats. If for example, Labor wins in your electorate, that is one seat, and the majority will become Premier.
