Dear Ikebal,

I refer to the AFIC media release dated 5 January 2009 "Condemnation of Muted Response", issued under your name, which stated:

"This is not the time to blame but the time for action when one is witnessing the very victims of the Holocaust now perpetrating much worse atrocities against the Palestinians..."

"The USA and Australia...should speak against the **brutal aggression of Israel**..." (emphasis added)

The Australian Jewish community objects in the strongest possible terms to the assertion that Israel's attack on Hamas' military infrastructure in Gaza is in any way comparable to, let alone worse than, the treatment of Jews in the Holocaust. The comparison is obscene and contemptible.

Yes, the loss of civilian life on both sides of the border is a tragedy. But do I really need to remind you of the scale of the Holocaust and the methods used, of the mass transports of millions of people to death camps and their systematic slaughter in the gas chambers? I am sure you are aware that 6 million Jews, including over 1 million Jewish children, were butchered by the Nazis. You merely invite incredulity and ridicule by comparing these events to civilian casualties in Gaza, especially in the context of Hamas's use of civilians as "human shields" and its unprecedented rocket attacks deliberately targeted at Israeli civilians.

Ikebal, of course you are entitled to express your and your organisation's views on any topic and in respect of some of those views we will obviously disagree, sometimes profoundly. Indeed I have previously written to you (8 September and 7 October 2008), urging a moderation of the polemical language you use in your public statements. I haven't received any response from you to my letters. The language that you have used most recently, demonstrates to me that our concerns have gone completely unheeded.

The Islamic world has on many occasions paid a heavy price for acting under the influence of the excessively fervid language of its leaders. Once again I urge you in the interests not only of our 2 organisations and the various dialogues and interactions that we are both involved in, but more importantly in the interests of the future relations of our respective communities, to express your views in temperate and not inflammatory language.
